#### **What is Floppy Phonics?**




## **All About Me**

## 5th Grade English Oral Presentation and Project


Students in the 5th grade are new to the II Unit! In the 5th grade classes, all 5th graders introduced themselves to their new class through a written and oral project – all about them!
